

Pastoral Letter

Palm Sunday: A Day of Triumph and Tears

Palm Sunday is a profoundly special day for Christians, filled with both jubilation and solemn reflection. It marks the day Jesus entered Jerusalem, not as a conventional warrior king would, with grandeur and might, but humbly, riding on a donkey. This profound act was a clear message: Jesus was a different kind of king.

In the gospels, Jesus seemed to avoid public spectacle and told those he healed to keep quiet about His miracles. Yet, on Palm Sunday, Jesus embraced public praise. This was not a pursuit of fame; rather, it was a declaration of His divine mission and the nature of His kingdom, a kingdom of love and sacrifice.

The crowds that day waved palm branches—an ancient symbol of victory—and cried out "Hosanna," which means "save us." Their cries acknowledged Jesus as king, though many may not have grasped how he was going to save people — as we see it was through his death on the cross.

Jesus highlighted the significance of this moment. He said that if the people remained silent, the stones themselves would cry out (Luke 19:40). By this he means that the entire creation recognized his kingship and the fulfilment of God's promises, even if the people didn't fully understand.

The celebration soon gave way to a sombre reality. Jesus wept over Jerusalem, mourning the city's coming suffering and rejection of him. He also cleansed the Temple, driving out those who were exploiting the sacred space, demonstrating his commitment to purify and renew God's house. These actions showed of his kingship— a king committed to justice, purity, and compassion.

Palm Sunday, therefore, is not merely a joyful parade; it is the beginning of Holy Week, the lead-up to Jesus's crucifixion. It points up the royal celebration of Jesus as Messiah with the path of suffering He would endure out of love for us.

Palm Sunday reminds us of the complexity of Jesus's mission. He came as a king but in a manner that turned worldly expectations upside down. His entry into Jerusalem was a fulfilment of the prophecy in Zechariah 9:9, which speaks of a king who comes "righteous and victorious, lowly and riding on a donkey." It was a clear sign that His kingdom was not of this world—it was not established by force and dominance but through humility, service, and sacrifice.

As we wave our palm branches, we do so not only to celebrate but also to prepare our hearts for the passion of Jesus. We remember that the true nature of Jesus's kingship involves profound love and sacrifice—the ultimate sacrifice on the cross, where Jesus died for our sins, showing us the greatest love of all.

This Palm Sunday, let us prepare our hearts to walk through Holy Week, with a deeper understanding and appreciation of what Jesus' kingship and what it means for us when we recognize him as our king.

Easter Egg Brownies

Ingredients

5 creme eggs 175g/6oz dark chocolate, broken into small pieces 175g/6oz unsalted butter, plus extra for greasing 2 tbsp cocoa powder 3 large free-range eggs 150g/5½oz caster sugar 150g/5½oz light brown sugar 1 tsp vanilla bean paste 115g/4oz plain flour ½ tsp fine sea salt 150g/5½oz shortbread biscuits, roughly chopped (optional)



Method

Place the chocolate eggs in the freezer. (This will make them easier to cut cleanly and means they won't melt too much in the oven.) Grease and line a square 20cm/8in cake tin. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4.

Place the chocolate, butter and cocoa powder in a heatproof glass bowl and set it over a saucepan of gently simmering water, making sure the water does not touch the bowl. Stir until completely melted and then remove from the heat. In a separate bowl, whisk together the eggs, caster sugar, light brown sugar and vanilla until smooth. Pour into the chocolate mixture and mix well. Add in the flour and salt and mix until smooth. Stir in the shortbread. Pour the mixture into the prepared tin.

Take the chocolate eggs out of the freezer and slice them in half vertically. Nestle them into the brownie mixture, with the insides of the eggs facing up, and bake for 27–30 minutes until just set. Remove from the oven and leave to cool completely before slicing into squares.
