Pastoral Letter

Embracing Lent: A Season of Renewal and Reflection

As we enter the season of Lent, we begin on a 40-day journey of reflection, prayer, and self-discipline, mirroring Jesus' time of fasting in the wilderness. Lent offers us a special opportunity for spiritual introspection and renewal. It is a time to consider our lives in light of our faith and to deepen our relationship with God.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, and ends on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter Sunday. This period excludes Sundays, which are considered feast days celebrating the resurrection of Jesus and are not counted in the 40 days of Lent. The primary purpose of Lent is to prepare for Easter through the three pillars of Lenten observance: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Each element serves to draw us closer to God and reflect on the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Lent is a time to enhance our prayer life. Consider setting aside specific times each day for prayer. This could involve participating in daily services at church, or online, personal Bible study, or meditative practices such as lectio divina, where the bible is read, meditated upon, and prayed over — you could use the bible readings in our YWOW sheet. Engaging with our Lent group can also enrich your spiritual journey.

This year, our parish is excited to offer a Lent course focused on resurrection, titled "The 3rd Day." This course is an excellent opportunity to delve deeper into the meaning of the resurrection and its impact on our faith and daily lives. I encourage everyone to participate as we explore this central tenet of Christianity through discussions, reflections, and shared insights.

Fasting during Lent helps us to discipline our bodies and focus our spirits. Traditionally, fasting involves abstaining from certain foods or meals. However, the spirit of fasting can also include giving up other comforts or habitual sins. This practice is not merely about depriving ourselves but about being freed up to be more attuned to God and more available to care for others.

Charitable giving (Almsgiving) helps us to focus beyond ourselves and to address the needs of others. This can involve donating money or goods to those in need or volunteering our time and talents. The act of giving is a reflection of God's generosity to us and is fundamental to a Christian life.

As we keep Lent, let us remember that this season is not just about personal sacrifice, but about preparing ourselves to celebrate Easter and the transformative power of Jesus' resurrection. It is a time to renew our faith, hope, and love, drawing nearer to God and reflecting God's light in our lives and communities. May this Lent be a time of meaningful sacrifice, prayerful reflection, and joyful anticipation of the resurrection of Christ.

In Fellowship

Kent Lent Tart

Ingredients For the pastry

180g Plain wholemeal flour 0.5 tsp Baking powder 90g Butter (salted) (at room temperature)

For the filling

200ml Milk (whole) 100ml Double cream 30g Ground rice 75g Butter (salted) (at room temperature) 75g Golden Caster Sugar 2 Eggs large, beaten 2 Lemons zest only 0.25 tsp Nutmeg 0.25 tsp Lemon extract



Method

35g Currants

Make the pastry either by hand or in a food processor. Line an 8" flan tin, prick the base, and refrigerate for 20 minutes to rest the pastry before baking blind at 180 deg C for 15 minutes until it is cooked, but not brown.

Meanwhile bring the milk, cream and rice to the boil, stirring continuously and simmer for 30 seconds until thickened, remove and cool.

Beat the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy.

Beat the eggs in gradually then add the lemon zest, nutmeg, lemon extract and the rice cream and beat until smooth.

Pour into the pastry case and sprinkle over a little extra nutmeg and the currants.

Bake in the oven for 30 minutes until firm to the touch and light brown, covering with foil
